

## REPORT OF THE 5<sup>th</sup> MOBILITY, NICOSIA, 29<sup>th</sup> March – 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2017















The 5<sup>th</sup> mobility of the Erasmus+ (KA2) project "**Ready for our lives**" was held from 29<sup>th</sup> March, 2017 to 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2017 in Nicosia, Italy.

The Czech delegation from "Obchodní akademie Karviná, s.r.o" in Karviná arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The delegation was composed of the project coordinator Mr. Martin Frolík, the headmistress Mrs. Slavka Krystová Florková, the payroll clerk Miss Alexandra Florková and the teacher Mrs. Zdeňka Parchanská and the students Miss Nelly Vlachopulosová, Mr. David Nastulczyk and Mr. Ondřej Ponča.

The **Latvian delegation** from the "Riga Secondary Night Shift School n°9", arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The delegation was composed of the headmistress Mrs. Ilze Dupate and the teacher Mrs. Jana Strautmane and the students Mr. Svjatoslavs Sirsovs, Mr. Raino Liberts and Miss Megija Sintija Matisa.

The **Turkish delegation** from the school "Özel Adalya Anadolu Lisesi" in Antalya arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. The delegation was composed of the headmaster Mr. Kenan Çelik, the teachers Mrs. Funda Vuslat Mackenzie, Mr. Bülent Boztunalı and Mrs. Fatma Songül Hazoğlu and the students Mr. Ayberk Konuk, Mr. Habib Abay, Miss Ece Apaydin and Mr. Mustafa Tunca Celik.

The **Portuguese delegation** from the school "Agrupamento de Escolas Alexandre Herculano" in Porto arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The delegation was composed of the teachers Mrs. Fátima Gama and Mrs. Lina Costa and the students Mr. João Meireles, Mr. João Campinho and Mr. Paulo Martins.

The **Slovenian delegation** from the school "Srednja ekonomsko-poslovna šola Koper" in Koper arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The delegation was composed of the headmistress Mrs. Branka Žerjal, the teachers Mrs. Nataša Jerman, Mrs. Nataša Vrčon Tratar and Mrs. Ingrid Baruca and the students Mr. Luka Končarevič, Miss Florentina Gashi, Miss Vivian Kozjak and Miss Eneja Ugrin.

The **Lithuanian delegation** from the school "Kedainiai Sviesioji Gymnasium" in Kedainiai arrived in Nicosia on March 28<sup>th</sup> and departed on April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2016. The delegation was composed from the headmistress Mrs. Violeta Liutkiené and the

teacher Mrs. Agne Bačiauskiené and the students Miss Radvilé Rušainté, Miss Emilija Vilčinskaité and Miss Eitvilé Mickevičiūtė.

The organizer of the 5<sup>th</sup> mobility was the Italian school I.I.S. "A. Volta in Nicosia.

On Tuesday March 28<sup>th</sup>, all the participants were welcomed by the school coordinator Mrs. Maria Filippa La Porta, the headmaster Mr. Felice Lipari and the teachers Maria La Licata and Mr. Ferdinando Lociuro and then transferred to the hotel and host families.

On Wednesday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, all the participants gathered at school where the welcome ceremony and presentations of the Italian school and the Italian educational system were presented. The Slovenian team showed the film "Memories from Lithuania" about the previous meeting. Later, the participating schools presented their own countries, towns and schools and after lunch also their results of the questionnaire on the topic of advertising and promotion. The host teachers and students then organized a short tour of Nicosia for their foreign guests. In the afternoon, all the participants were welcomed by the Lord Mayor of Nicosia Mr. Luigi Bonelli at the Town hall. Then the programme continued at school and next presentations of the partner school followed. The foreign students spent their evening with their host families, while the teachers had a common dinner.

On Thursday, March 30<sup>th</sup>, the teams gathered at the school where the presentations and workshop with role play on the topic of immigrants at the job market called "One world for all" took place. Then the exhibition of Sicilian culture and traditions prepared by the Italian students and a catwalk of typical Sicilian clothes followed. In the afternoon, the participants visited La Giusa Next Company and were guided by the expert technician Mr. Luigi Accardi. The participants learned more about production of furniture, marketing and promotion. Then, the National cuisine afternoon with a cultural programme organized by a Sicilian folk group Amastra took place in the school. All the countries presented their typical sweets, food and drinks and the participating students could also practise typical Sicilian dances.

On Friday, March 31<sup>st</sup>, there was a whole day excursion to Palermo. First, we had a meeting and discussion with the town councellor Mrs. Agnese Ciulla on the topic of immigration at the Contemporary art gallery and then we took part in a guided tour to Palazzo de Normanni and Capella Palatina which houses the Sicilian Parliament.

On Saturday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, the programme started at the University KORE in Enna where a lecture on marketing given by prof. Mrs. Annalisa Bonomo took place. Afterwards, the participants were guided round the new university library. In the afternoon, we learned more about Sicilian history during a guided tour of Villa del Casale in Piazza Armerina (UNESCO heritage) where we could see the mosaics.

On Sunday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>, the students learned about the culture, the way of life and about traditions of Sicilia together with their host families while the teachers visited the most important places of interest in Nicosia and its neighborhood (e.g. Cefalu).

On Monday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, the students and teachers visited the company Pandittaino for an excursion. In the afternoon, the teachers had their evaluation meeting followed by planning the work for the period between the meetings in Italy and Latvia. The

teachers also discussed the activities to be done during the meeting in Riga in October 2017. Later, the Ceremony with Awarding Certificates followed, then the students were interviewed by TeleNicosia and the programme was concluded with the farewell dinner for the teachers. The 5<sup>th</sup> mobility was officially concluded.

On Tuesday, April 4<sup>th</sup>, resp. Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> late in the evening (the Turkish group) the delegations departed from Nicosia to their countries.

During the 5<sup>th</sup> mobility the teachers agreed on the tasks to be done for the 6<sup>th</sup> meeting in Latvia which will be held from 11<sup>th</sup> October to 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2017 (with travel days on 10<sup>th</sup> October and 17<sup>th</sup> October).

- Each country will make a powerpoint presentation of the results of surveys on presentation of a company (5-10 minutes max.). Each school will involve 30 students into the research.
- Each country will make a powerpoint presentation / videopresentation on the topic of mobbing in companies. (5-10 minutes max.). Each country will develop their work on their own using the most appropriate methods they find the most useful. The work will be presented at the workshop called "You and me".
- Each country will carry out a discussion / a debate on fair working environment with responsible people at their local authorities on the issue of presentation of a company.
- Each country will prepare a presentation of their country, town and school (5-7 minutes max.) to be presented during the meeting in Latvia.
- Each country will prepare some national dishes that will be presented at the evening of national cuisine at the Latvian school.

During the 5<sup>th</sup> mobility the delegations also agreed on the following:

- The Latvian team will prepare 10 common questions for the questionnaire on presentation of a company and the other partners can add other questions (max. 10) based on their own needs and situations. The questionnaires will be sent to partner schools by the end of April. The answers should be sent to the Latvian school by the end of May.
- Each country will carry out a research on the issue of mobbing in companies to be presented during the meeting in Latvia.
- Each country will prepare a presentation of their country, town and school for the meeting in Latvia.
- The Lithuanian school will publish the evaluation form by April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 and will collect the answers and work out the evaluation results by **May 8<sup>th</sup>**, 2017. For this evaluation, the e-Twinning platform will be used. Only the participating students and teachers will take part in this evaluation. The results will be published on twinspace by **May 15<sup>th</sup>**, 2017.
- All participating schools will send their newsletters by June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 to the Turkish school. Maximum pages of each newsletter will be 4 pages

per a school. The participating schools should use word format and picasa for their photos.

- The Italian school will update the pages on e-Twinning so that the visitors could see the results of our work.
- The Czech school will upload the results of our work (presentations, questionnaires etc.) on the website and the facebook page.
- Each school is recommended to publish their results of work on their school web pages or school facebook pages, in local media etc. Newspaper articles will be also presented on the webpage of the project.
- The Latvian school will send the other partners the programme of the 6<sup>th</sup> mobility and the host families' contacts by September 25<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
- The Lithuanian school will organize a Skype conference; the exact date will be agreed by the school coordinators.
- The Italian school will organize an e-Twinning video conference; the exact date will be agreed by the school coordinators.
- The Slovenian school will work out the video-presentation from the meeting in Italy to be presented at the meeting in Latvia.
- The Czech school will work out the 2<sup>nd</sup> Coordinator's report and will send it to the partner schools by the end of July 2017.
- The participating leaders and headmasters / headmistresses will think of the exact dates of the 7<sup>th</sup> meeting in the Czech Republic. The dates will be confirmed during the meeting in Latvia.
- The leaders of the participating schools will check their access to their Mobility Tool and in case of any problems they will contact their National Agencies and will also inform the coordinator of the project.
- The leaders of the participating schools will check their budgets and agree on monitoring visits to be held during the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year / resp. the beginning of the of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of the project. Only school coordinators mentioned in the application form and the headmasters/headmistresses will be allowed to participate in the monitoring visits.

All the participants of the "Ready for our lives" project appreciate the effort, the work and the warm hospitality of the Italian organizers of the 5<sup>th</sup> mobility. All the participants find the activities very interesting and agree they learned a lot during the meeting. All the planned tasks and activities were fully accomplished.

The next meeting is going to be held in Riga, Latvia in October 2017.
